

Welcome Scullers!

Welcome to BIAC! Now that you've completed your Learn to Scull sessions (or if you have prior sculling experience), we'd like to help you make the best use of our club and your time on the water. To gain access to the boat yard and clubhouse, you need the following code: BIAC, entered as 2 5 4 1 3 (B=2, I=9=5+4; A=1, C=3).

Your membership login and the BIAC website pages

Learn to Scull graduates are already in our member database. If you registered online, you have your login password. If not, go to our website to create one.

1. Go to gobair.org, enter your email address in the login box on the top right, and click [Forgot password](#). A new page opens.
2. Re-enter your email address at the prompt, as well as the verification code, and click "Reset password".
3. You will get an email with instructions on how to re-set your password. Open the email and proceed as instructed.

Now you can log in with your new password, and get full web site access (including the Members area). When you get a chance, please edit your profile while you are logged in. Click [View Profile](#) in the login box, then [Edit Profile](#). Make sure your name, contact information, and emergency contact information are up-to-date. Be sure to click "Save" at the bottom of the screen to save your changes. You can add a photo to your profile and set privacy options. Most of us keep the defaults, and keep things transparent to club members.

Other responsibilities

Each group at BIAC is responsible for maintaining specific boats; expect to do maintenance approximately one Saturday a quarter. We also need help to keep the club running: finances, facilities, communications, equipment maintenance, regattas, social events, etc. If you think of ways to improve our club, please talk to any board member or to the Scullers group lead, Aisha Chow. As an all-volunteer organization, BIAC requires members to provide 12 hours of volunteer work per year.

Club dues

Annual dues set by the club, currently \$450, pay for buying boats, ergs and other equipment; maintenance; rent and costs associated with our property, etc. If you joined via the Learn to Scull program, that fee covers membership dues and equipment usage for one month. When this trial membership expires (or for experienced scullers joining our club), be sure to edit your profile and convert your membership to Annual Row/Scull. Your dues and boat usage fees are pro-rated for the remainder of the year, which ends on April 30.
